TRADITIONAL ESSAY

In this assignment choice, you will type a well organized multi-paragraph essay following MLA format. You will want to thoroughly answer the teacher's prompt and include evidence from your class resources.

PODCAST

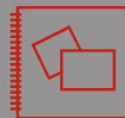
